Carrie Almond was elected NFRW president at the 38th Biennial Convention in Phoenix and took office in January 2016.

Previously, she served the NFRW as second vice president, treasurer, member-at-large, executive liaison to the Program and Public Relations committees, and director of Regions 4 and 8.

She has been active in the NFRW since her involvement with the Missouri FRW, for which she served as president, first vice president, second vice president and treasurer.

Almond is also involved in her community of Chillicothe, Missouri, where she served as treasurer of the Livingston County Animal Shelter for 10 years and has been active in the local arts council and rotary club. She was also the treasurer of Grace Episcopal Church, and served as chair of the Audit Committee and three terms on the Vestry.

Almond is an executive vice president of Citizens Bank & Trust, a northern Missouri bank with 20 branches in 19 towns. Additionally, she manages the family farm of more than 2,000 acres. Her banking career spans the states of South Carolina, Georgia and Florida. After graduating from the University of South Carolina, she worked for the Union Bank of Switzerland in Lausanne.

She has been married to Scott Huddleston since 2007 and jokes that with his four sons and her many dogs, it's like the Brady Bunch with tails.

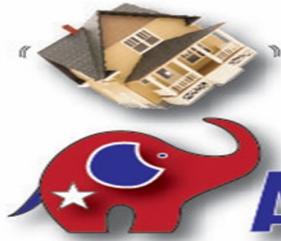
Allison Ball

Kentucky State Treasurer

Allison Ball—is the 38th State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the youngest statewide female elected official in the country. Prior to her role as State Treasurer, Treasurer Ball practiced bankruptcy law and focused on consumer rights and commercial litigation. As part of her time in public service, Treasurer Ball spent four years as an Assistant Floyd County Attorney, prosecuting child abuse and juvenile delinquency cases.

Treasurer Ball is focusing on strengthening transparency in state government, while also being a watchdog for Kentucky taxpayer money spent in Frankfort. As a member of the Kentucky Teacher Retirement Systems board, Treasurer Ball is also committed to helping solve the pension crisis.

Treasurer Ball is still active in her community, serving as the Co-Chair of the Board of Directors of the Young Professionals of Eastern Kentucky.

**House Minority Floor Leader
Kentucky House of Representatives**

Jeff Hoover -born January 18, 1960 in Albany, Kentucky is a Republican member of the Kentucky House of Representatives representing the 83rd district where he has served since 1996. Hoover was selected to serve as House Minority Caucus Chair in 1999, and serves as House Minority Leader, a position he has held since 2001. Hoover is a 1982 graduate of Centre College and a 1987 graduate of Cumberland School of Law.

Hoover was re-elected Republican Floor Leader in the Kentucky House in January, 2011 and is now the longest serving Republican Leader in the history of the Kentucky House of Representatives.

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AWARDS TO BE PRESENTED AT 2016 KFRW BIENNIAL CONVENTION

CLUB GROWTH- Awarded to the club who has shown the greatest percentage increase in Regular members (not student or associate) from 2015 to 2016. This award is based on dues sent in by the deadline of July 1. Dues must be postmarked to the KFRW treasurer by July 1 to be counted for this award.

Awards will be given for three categories: one for clubs with 2015 membership of 10-30 members, one for clubs with 31-60 2016 members, and one for clubs with 61+ 2016 members. \$100 cash prize for each category.

MARKETING- Awarded to the club judged to have the best methods for sharing news, keeping members informed, attracting new members, and marketing Republican Women's Clubs to the community. \$100 cash prize.

LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITY- Awarded to the club judged to have done the best job of advocating for legislation and educating members about the legislative process and upcoming proposed legislation. \$100 cash prize.

CARING FOR AMERICA PROJECT(S)- Awarded to the club judged to have the most innovative project(s) that serves the community in the name of Republican Women. \$100 cash prize.

CAMPAIGN ACTIVITY- Awarded to the club judged to have done the best job encouraging, promoting, and campaigning for Republican candidates, including encouraging women to run for office and having a member of their club run for office. \$100 cash prize.

The first category will be based strictly on numerical information regarding dues paid in 2015 and in 2016. The other club awards will be based on write-ups e-mailed to Carol Rogers, Awards Chairman, by July 20th. carolrogers125@gmail.com. The awards committee will judge the awards. A cash prize of \$100 will be awarded for each category, with three \$100 prizes given for membership based on category.

HALL OF FAME- This is awarded at every convention and was started in 2010. Any member may nominate a KFRW member who has given long and outstanding service to the KFRW. Any KFRW member may nominate a woman for this award by sending a letter of nomination, not to exceed two pages, to the KFRW president no later than July 20. A permanent plaque will be placed in the RPK Headquarters listing the awardees name and an award presented at the convention. A maximum of three awards may be presented each year. The awards may be awarded posthumously.
