## Voter Integrity Bill H.B. 574

A Voter Integrity Bill, HB 574 was introduced into the Kentucky House of Representatives on February 23, 2021. The sponsors of the bill are Representative Jennifer Decker (House Dist 58), Representative Josh Branscum (House Dist 83) and Representative James Tipton (House Dist 53).

The Senate version of the same legislation, SB 259, was introduced into the Kentucky Senate on February 22, 2021 by Majority Caucus Chair, Senator Julie Raque Adams, (Senate Dist 63),

HB 574 passed the House of Representatives on February 26, 2021. It was received by the Committee on Committees in the Kentucky Senate on March 1, 2021.

Senate Bill 259 was introduced in the Committee on Committees on February 22, 2021. The Bill did pass both houses on March 29th. It was delivered to the governor for his signature on March 30th.
