

The 42<sup>nd</sup> biennial convention will be held Sept. 28-Oct. 1, 2023 in Oklahoma City. At the convention, recognition will be given in several categories, including Armed Services. Thank you to **Chair Lynette Heppner** for summarizing the KFRW clubs who submitted Armed Service Awards:

**Jessamine County Republican Women** served Veterans in multiple capacities this past year. They donated snack items to the Thomson Hood Veterans Center on a monthly basis, and completed a Silly Sock project by donating Christmas gifts to approximately one hundred Veterans. They honored 2 veterans with one hundred-year birthdays by participating in a birthday card project for both of them.

**Estill County Republican Women** provided support to 4 newly enlisted service members this year. Jessica Myers, who is a club member, and her husband who is a Retired Air Force Veteran, presented gift certificates and cards from their club members to each service member at an awards ceremony for Estill County High

School graduates. They also supported a local veteran candidate, State Representative Bill Wesley, during his campaign.

**Oldham County Republican Women** supported their local Veterans by participating in the Oldham County Memorial Day Observance Service, which was sponsored by the American Legion Post #39. They set up a refreshment table and provided free donuts, coffee and water to all guests and participants. Jan Jasper, a club member, accompanied a military WWII hero who spoke during the service and obtained a letter of recognition from the Post Commander thanking the ladies from their club. They also donated \$200.00 to the Fisher House, which supports families of injured service men and women.



Described as a "dramatic, moving and thriller-like account", **RED NOTICE** is a must-read for anyone curious about the inner workings of Putin's world in Russia. This non-fiction book resonates against the backdrop of the current Ukraine/Russia war. From the NYTimes: "Here's the craziest part: it's all true." Author Bill Browder, a sometimes TV guest, a sometimes Congressional witness, an always on-therun fugitive, describes his book (and his follow-up one FREEZING ORDER) as a memoir.
