







BOOK REVIEW

MELP participation is a requirement for the NFRW Achievement Awards and September is Literacy and Education month. Thus, “there is no better time than the present” to donate a book to a local library either public or to the school of your choice.

We all know our country’s history is not being taught in many school systems and patriotism is at an all-time heartbreaking low. Because of this, my suggestion for this month’s book is a children’s five book series by Rush Limbaugh: THE INCREDIBLE ADVENTURES OF RUSH REVERE . For Christmas one year, we gave each of our grandchildren’s families a set of this series. The stories delighted the children along with the parents as they read nightly from them.



Not only are the books educational but they are also entertaining. You might enjoy reading the series yourselves as I did, even though the reading age is 4-7! Rush and Liberty, his wise-cracking horse, become time travelers through important events in our country’s history.

The book set begins with Rush’s adventures on the Mayflower as we meet the brave Pilgrims. “You’ll experience exactly what they did on that rough dangerous ocean crossing”. In the second book you “jump into the bustling streets of Boston in 1765 where talk of revolution is growing louder”. Book three features “the Father of our Constitution, James Madison, in heated secret debates on our Constitution” and his wife Dolly who “risks her life to save an important portrait as the British set Washington afire!” The final book introduces us directly to the first three presidents

in action: George Washington, John Adams and Thomas Jefferson.

The series receives 5 stars in over 1600 reviews and is \$57.50 on Amazon. That's \$12 a book. It will be money well-spent. For your library donation, please remember to attach a NFRW template inside the front cover. The link for the templates is **HERE!**
